

Dear Families

At last a Friday that I begin with 'the sun is out!' Everything seems so much better when we can get outside and enjoy some summer weather.

This week in school we have completed reports and I have enjoyed reading every single one of them. Most satisfying has been to write 'we are looking forward to seeing you soon.' As you know the government has announced its intentions for school to plan that all children are back in school in September.

A new phase of **planning and risk assessing** has now begun for our COVID19 Team. A draft risk assessment has now been produced but there remains a considerable amount of work ahead over the summer break to complete this to ensure that we can welcome all of our children back in as safe a way as possible. A particular challenging we are currently working through is whether we will be able to offer Before and After School care given the constraints of the guidance – I will keep you updated about this. 



Here are some interesting facts about Ilkley moor.




