Children have been encouraged to use the outside of the bag to write and draw messages of support for the eventual recipients which we will put inside the shoeboxes. Filled bags should be brought back to school on Thursday 17th October—your child will make their donation during our Harvest festival in the afternoon. The School Council will be responsible for sorting your donations into shoeboxes—our aim is to fill between 30 and 50 shoeboxes as a school.

This was followed by a whole load of incredible (largely edible) investigations in class which we have all shared with each other in an assembly. The range of activities and excitement they have generated around school

We've had eggs in vinegar, bouncing fruit, fizzing pop, colourful sweets, chocolatey hands, churned butter and tested fats. Our week started with the question: Is Science the same as magic? - it has certainly been a science filled magical week.

Governors Business Group Meeting

The Governors business group met for the first time this academic year this week.

The group has oversight for the following areas:

Health and Safety and associated policies, Safeguarding and associated policies, HR including safer recruitment, school business continuity, finance and associated policies, website compliance and information technology, school Security. Our governors bring a wealth of professional experience to this group. You can read about the members of our Governors Business Group [here](#) or by visiting our school website.

At this meeting the governors discussed the following

Budget Monitoring— Despite challenging times in educational funding our school continues to steer a steady course financially and is in a secure position moving forwards. We look forward to receiving the promised increase to our funding promised by central government.

Family Fundraising— We acknowledged that the work of the school by the Family Fundraisers group and their recent significant financial contribution to school will greatly enhance the experiences our children receive.

Health and Safety— Our Health and Safety Policy has been received together with an annual report of the site. There are a few minor site issues (like replacing high level light bulbs) which need rectifying and plans are in place for these to be carried out. In line with best practice we also considered site security and discussed a Revised Lockdown policy in case of emergency.

Brexit— following guidance from DFE and NYCC we considered the potential impact of a no deal Brexit on the school. We have received assurances from our caterers, Dolce, about the steps they have made to ensure the continued smooth running of their lunchtime service. We decided that we will provide parents with information about what might happen if fuel stocks run low and the school is forced to close because we can't heat the building or staff can't get into work.

After School Club— we discussed an issue around a small number of persistent late pick ups from our After school club. The Governor agreed that the terms and conditions need revising and will be sending these home shortly.

Governor Networking— a representative of our Governing Body attended the recent CASTLE Governors network which enables us to have strong working links with other local schools governing bodies. At the meeting best value of outsourced services was considered..

21 children from Years 4, 5 and 6 went to Glusburn Cricket Club on Friday morning to compete and perform at the annual Fall-fest event. They had to sing two songs, one which was judged by professional musicians and one alongside 3 other schools which linked to the Queen theme this year. The judges highly commended their singing saying that they performed well together and sounded beautiful. They were equally as impressed with their sign language too which they included during the chorus of "This is Me" from the Greatest Showman. We had a fabulous time and are looking forward to competing again next
