1. When dogs are sleeping, leave them alone.
2. When dogs are eating, leave them alone.
3. Remember dogs don't like loud noises
4. Dogs like strokes, not hugs
5. If a dog takes your toy, tell a grown up.

KS2 children were also able to tell me how you should always ask an owner's permission before you stroke a dog, only stroke an unfamiliar dog on its shoulder and not all 'cute' dogs are friendly!

It was a wonderful day and important for the children to learn how to enjoy their pets and keep themselves safe.

AFTER SCHOOL MELTDOWN?

Picture the scene: your child comes out of school and the teacher says they've behaved like the perfect child all day, but the moment you get home they have a complete meltdown. Your child screams, shouts, lashes out, sulks or generally acts in an unruly manner. If that scene is familiar to you, you're not alone. This type of behaviour is what some psychologists refer to as 'after-school restraint collapse' and it's not unusual. It happens because your child has been busy managing their emotions all day as they navigate the complexities of school life.

Parents' Toolkit from BBC Bitesize has been speaking to educational and child psychologist Dr Anisa-Ree Moses, for some tips on how to handle these outburst of emotions after-school.
