We currently provide school meals through North Yorkshire County Catering. They are free for YR/Y1 & Y2 and cost £2.82 per day for other year groups. Meals are freshly cooked each day in our kitchen by NYCC Meals must be taken as a full week. With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For food ordering purposes the school office requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals.





You can play your part by:

DO

- ◇ Print this information and keep in a safe place.
- ◇ Make sure your child comes dressed appropriately for the weather outside everyday. (Coat, hat, gloves, wellies)
- ◇ If you can't arrive on time, come in when it is safe to do so.
- ◇ Remember that, unless the weather is really severe, the children are encouraged to get out into the fresh air and have a 'run around'. If it snows we will often go outside to play in the park!

DON'T

- ◇ Phone school as this blocks our telephone line.
- ◇ Phone radio stations for information; they will broadcast details regularly.
- ◇ Assume we are open/closed just because other local schools are. Whilst we do liaise with other schools, ultimately the decision is based on the safety of our school family.
- ◇ Send children to school until you have checked. We will understand if on such days children arrive late.









Learning to Love Reading

We wrote to you at the beginning of the school year and shared with you our plans to help children learn to *Love Reading*. We made a commitment that every day in every class children will listen to a story or a novel. Obviously younger children listen to lots of short stories which develop into longer novels as they progress through school.

Teachers are currently planning another exciting term of learning for after Christmas. All children will be read to at least daily as we believe that, to be read to and hearing how to read, are an important part of becoming a skilled reader. 
