With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For food ordering purposes the school office requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals.

Hello and welcome back to a new year in the Library, where we are continually working to improve our Library resource and encourage a love of reading across our school family. Whether we are reading to our children or listening to them read to us, it is an invaluable foundation of our learning and time never wasted.

Last year was a busy one and saw the beginning of our Library overhaul and the introduction of Reading Cloud; our online reading resource and library management system.

This year is looking just as busy as we continue to review the stock and add new titles. We will be having a particular focus on updating our non-fiction section and making it easier **for the children to find their way around this area.**

Here's a reminder of how our library works...

All children in school are able to borrow a book (in addition to their reading book) for up to **3 weeks**. Books are borrowed on the understanding children are responsible for the care and return of that book.

After **3 weeks** the book needs to be returned to the library and scanned back in to the system; it can then be exchanged for another book or renewed for a further 3 weeks if necessary.

Each child has their own **barcode number**; books scanned out in their name remain their responsibility until it has been scanned back into the system.

All year groups have the opportunity during the week to exchange and renew their books. In addition, the Library is open until 4pm on a Friday if you want a fresh book for the weekend.

Please encourage your child to take care of our books so that other families can enjoy them too.

Our 2018 Data showed continuing improvement from the previous year, with notable successes in Y1 Phonics and KS1 SATs. It was particularly pleasing to note the improvement made in reading across the school which was a whole school focus last year. Full details of test performance will shortly be posted on the school website. Each year we use a range of sources to set priorities for the upcoming year. Your child may already be able to tell you what some of these are as we have been using assemblies this week to discuss them. Written in child friendly language we have set the following aspirations for the end of 18-19

Priority 1 : I will love Reading

Read Read Read!

We firmly believe that reading unlocks the key for learning—it's like a tiny bit of magic. If you can read you can learn and, without this skill, everything is so much harder. This year we will be working hard to further develop our children's skill in reading, and by the end of the year it is our aspiration for every child to 'love reading.' As part of this commitment we will continue to develop the fantastic work in the school library. Having appointed our own librarian, Mrs Broughton, last year, children will continue to have access to an ever growing number of quality reading books to take read in school and also take home. This year we have bought a range of age appropriate readers to be based in class—you will recognise several old favourites amongst them; books which children can read and read again (because they love them!)

Teachers will be reading to their class at least once a day—because we believe that being read to helps children develop their own art of reading out loud. We strongly recommend that you buy a copy of the current class novel if your child is Y3 and above because reading along when listening develops the skills of understanding the text. At home you can help your child by re-reading sections and pre reading. Whilst we sometimes think that we only need to read something once, in fact the opposite is true. Re reading and pre reading all adds to the understanding and comprehension of stories—all adding to the skills needed to be a consummate reader.



REMINDERS

School Uniform

We pride ourselves on the appearance of our school and this includes school uniform. There is plenty of choice within our uniform code for children to express their individuality— please note that we do not encourage children to wear brightly coloured trainers and shoes with flashing lights can be a great distraction in school!

Attendance

School starts promptly at 8.55. We ask that children are not taken out of school for routine appointments (such as dental/ medical/optician). Proof of any appointments during the school day is always required. If you fail to provide this, your child's absence may be recorded as unauthorised which could lead to referral to the Area Prevention Service. If your child is absent, you should notify school by phone before 9.30 am.

Lunch boxes

We have trolleys to keep lunch boxes on for each class. Packed lunches are stored during the morning in a cool place and children are asked not to keep their lunch in the cloak-room where there are heating pipes. We therefore ask that when your child brings a lunchbox to school, it is small enough to fit on the trolleys. The trolleys take standard size children's lunchboxes but are not built to store large bags.

PE bags and kit

Every child has a named school PE bag which should be brought to school every Monday and taken home for washing every Friday. Please ensure PE kit is labelled with your child's name. Children from Y1-Y6 need black shorts, white T shirt and pumps/trainers. You might like to send them with dark coloured jogging bottoms and a school purple sports hoodie when the weather gets colder. Your child will be able to tell you whether they are planning inside or outside PE this term.

We do not have the space to store large unwieldy bags and ask that children **do not bring them into school**—school book bags can be purchased for home learning/reading books.

Jewellery including hooped earrings are not permitted.

Pierced earrings should be studs.

Replacement PE bags cost £5.50

Water bottles now cost £2.00

Book bags £9.00

Payment via uniform service on parent pay

Medicines in School

If your child needs to take a prescribed medicine during the school day, please see Mrs Wallace in the school office to complete a form. Non prescribed medications (such as cough sweets) are not allowed in school.
