

Dear Families

This week in school things have settled into a good routine. Children and staff are happy. Morning drop offs and after school picks ups are all going to plan—you will have noticed that we currently have a member of staff wearing a [yellow jacket](#) stationed at the entrance to the unmade up road during these times. Please use the unmade up road to walk down with your children. This enables you to observe social distancing rules rather than using the pavements which may become overcrowded and obviously please don't attempt to drive up the unmade road!



As you will no doubt have seen in today's national press, the government has allocated a package worth £1billion that will directly support schools over the next two years. Importantly, previous headlines suggesting a 'summer of catch-up classes' appear to have been replaced with a more sensible, long-term plan. Whilst we now await further details, on the surface this announcement does appear to be a positive development and it clearly represents a considerable investment.

You may have read in the local press about the kind donation of PPE equipment we have received from [Airedale Chemicals](#). Over time we have built up a great working relationship with this local company which has involved chemists visiting school and groups of children visiting their premises. I also want to thank the D&T team at [South Craven School](#) for making and providing face visors for us to use in school should the need arise.

I have met with Mrs Fletcher and Miss Dunkley to finalise the plans for our [Y6 leavers' celebrations](#). Whilst we are unable to have all of our Y6's back in school, we have been able to adapt our existing traditions in the light of the current pandemic and hope that it might be possible for families to join us virtually. More details will follow.

Our [Essential Childcare Bubbles](#) are quite full; each can hold a maximum of 15 children. Please only book a place if you are unable to care for your child at home—this is to ensure that Keyworkers who have to work away from home can use the service. We all need to support each other with this, otherwise we might be put into the position of having to turn people away.

Children in [Home Bubbles](#) are invited to access the learning posted daily by their class teachers via Tapestry or Google Classroom. Mrs Kerr and Mrs Dwyer are now [ringing children who are at home](#) on a regular basis—this week they have tried to make contact with all children at home; please encourage your child to talk to them. This will continue for the rest of this term.

Mrs Bailey (EY and KS1) and Miss Robinson (KS2) are available everyday online in Tapestry and Google classrooms to support your child with their questions. [Parents of children at home](#) can contact them by email with questions, worries and concerns - see details further on in the newsletter.

Much work has taken place this week to build our capacity to offer [online learning sessions](#), initially for children at home. A [YR zoom](#) session invitation for Monday 22nd June has been emailed to parents. The glitch in [Google Meet](#) seems to have been ironed out and later in this newsletter you can find the dates and times of these face to face sessions next week. Children are invited via their Google Classroom stream—the same way in which they access the learning posted by their teachers.

I want to reassure you that our staff work very cohesively as a team. We are in regular contact and our communication systems are very effective. If you speak to one of us, messages do get passed on to the most appropriate person.

On a final note please can I ask you to [follow the government guidance around social distancing](#) and to minimise the number of people your child mixes with when they are not in school? This will help to keep our school family safe and lessen the risk of COVID 19 transmission in our community.





NHS Track and Trace





I didn't . . .



