The Fiver Challenge provides a highly interactive, fun way of introducing financial education, enterprise and the world of work to primary school pupils as they aim to make as much profit from £5 in four weeks. Each of our 6 Pupil Voice Groups are now hard at work planning their enterprise project.

Each group (Librarians, Fundraisers, Buddies, Green, Global, Tuckshop) are pledged £5 from the Fiver bank and have one month to set up a mini Fiver business and create a product or service they can then sell or deliver at a profit whilst engaging with their local community. Pupils are in full control of the profits they earn and get to decide what to spend them on.

Roosters/Early Birds News

You will have noticed that a **bell** has been recently fitted to the entrance door for Early Birds and Roosters. You should now gain access to drop off or pick up your children by ringing the doorbell. A member of staff will come and let you in. Please be aware that you may experience a short delay as staff will be busy looking after children. **Please do not prop the outside door open and remember to close it behind you.** These measures have been put in place to increase the safety of your child whilst they are in the clubs.

(You should continue to pick your child up from the main entrance and wait in the library if they are attending an after school club such as fencing or dodgeball.)

Arrival at School

Please be reminded that the school day begins at **8.55** when the doors open ;this allows for a prompt start in classes at 9.00am. There are a small number of the same children arriving at school after 9.00am everyday. This is not beneficial for them or their class

Lost learning = 25 minutes a week if five minutes late and 50 minutes if ten minutes late every day.

Term 2 Attendance is now being currently analysed—if your child's attendance fell below 95% last term, we will be letting you know in writing so that you can keep an eye on this. Research shows that 95% is the minimum attendance needed to ensure good progress in school.

School meals are free for YR/Y1 & Y2 and cost £2.10 per day for other year groups. Meals are freshly cooked each day in our kitchen by Mrs.



Johnson. Meals must be taken as a full week. With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For food ordering purposes **the school office** requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals.

In our commitment to develop children's critical literacy skills, we have teamed up with Picture News to help develop their understanding and appreciation of the news.

Having age-appropriate conversations with your child about the news keeps them interested and informed about what's happening in the world...and you too!

They move from wanting to know what happens in MY world to what is happening in THE world and their place in it.

By having regular conversations about the news you are able to share a whole range of topics and together make more sense of different events, issues and stories.

There are no rules or script to follow but you might want to watch, listen, read and discuss the news selectively.

Some significant news stories can be frightening and you will need to consider what your child can cope with and whether they are developmentally ready to understand certain events. For example, you might decide to listen to the news rather than watch it as there may be images they might find upsetting.

Talking about the major headlines of the day and current affairs is important so that children grow up as global citizens but it's important too to share a variety of fun and exciting news stories from the worlds of sport, entertainment, music, science, etc as well as local news closer to home.

Bags 2School

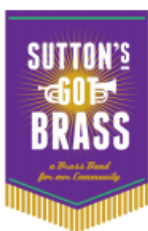
