We currently provide school meals through North Yorkshire County Catering. They are free for YR/Y1 & Y2 and cost £2.82 per day for other year groups. Meals are freshly cooked each day in our kitchen by Mrs Johnson. Meals must be taken as a full week. With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For food ordering purposes the school office requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals.

Green Group needs your help

Green Group would like to make some bird boxes and bird feeders. Naturally being 'green' we want to reuse and recycle.

Our plans for bird boxes/feeders start off with a piece of wood at least 15mm thick (for insulation), about 150mm wide and at least 1170mm long. Any kind of wood is fine but it must not be painted and must be free of nails/fixings as the children will be making these and rusty nails and children are not a good combination.

We also need some galvanised or stainless steel nails to hold the wood together; about 40-50mm should do the trick.

Lastly, one old car tyre inner tube would be good to make the lid hinges. Thanks in anticipation!

Our 2018 Data showed improvement from the previous year, with notable successes in Y1 Phonics and KS1 SATs. It was particularly pleasing to note the improvement made in reading across the school which was a whole school focus last year. Full details of test performance is posted on the school website. Each year we use a range of sources to set priorities for the upcoming year. Your child may already be able to tell you what some of these are as we have been using assemblies this week to discuss them. Written in child friendly language we have set the following as aspirations for the end of 2018-19

1. I will know and use numbers to solve problems
2. I will use words well
3. I will love to read
4. I will be active in my learning
5. I will know about life beyond Sutton

Priority 1 : I will know about life beyond Sutton

The national curriculum provides pupils with an introduction to the essential knowledge that they need to be educated citizens. It introduces pupils to the best that has been thought and said; and helps engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement. National Curriculum 2014.

Growing up is all about new experiences—childhood is a magical time and we want our children to have firm roots in the place that they grow. Part of this is to experience life beyond their immediate home and school. In our world of ever growing access to technologies, virtual worlds and busy lives, we are mindful that some of the simple joyful childhood experiences may be lost.

In 2018/19 here are some of the opportunities we will be offering:

Forest Schools—Encouraging learning in the outdoors—Y3/4 will have regular outdoor learning in the woods, hills and valleys around our school. You can keep up to date with their weekly adventures on our school Facebook Page. This year we plan to introduce the Forest School Approach to our youngest children too. Local visits—we'll be looking to augment learning in classroom with local visits, whether this is simply walking to the cenotaph in the park, visiting the shops in the village; every opportunity will be planned to extend children's thinking, skills and knowledge.


Simple things—we know that many of our children travel by family car everywhere so we'll be looking to walk, travel by coach, bus and train if we can so that children can have these experiences.

Planned Giving—by carefully planning a programme of charity giving over the year, we'll enable our children to find out about the lives of others, perhaps less fortunate than themselves. We want to instil our children with the belief that everyone can do something to help and make a positive difference.

Exploring the world—and beyond—we'll make every use of technology and invite specialists in like the Space Dome at the beginning of term.

Careers—During the year we'll plan opportunities from the world of work activities in order for children to find out about some of the choices that they will have when they are older. If you'd like to be involved in this please see Mrs Fletcher. Our belief is that education unlocks doors—and that the more successful children are in school, the more choices they have as adults.


