

Dear Families

Time seems to move strangely at the moment, everything in school seems rather different too. We have settled into the current school pattern in school, with our seven 'bubbles' largely year group based working in complete isolation from each other. The huge amount of careful planning we undertook is now paying dividends and children and staff are happy.

At this point I want to pay particular thanks to a small group of [School Governors](#), our [COVID 19 group](#). The group was formed from our existing governing body during the early, very difficult, days when we had a seemingly constant stream of constantly reviewed Government guidance to implement. For about a month the group met every day at 5pm with Mrs Fletcher and myself. Together we worked through the enormous task ahead. The COVID19 group members each have relevant professional experiences; education, law, public order, business continuity and health and safety. The workload was phenomenal for us all and for governors unpaid. I won't embarrass them by naming them here—but they know who they are—we all owe you a debt of gratitude for your continuing work. The group continue to meet, weekly at present. We continue to monitor to local infection rate, review our risk assessments and to consider information received for the Local Authority and national government. The Education Secretary has recently announced that he expects all children to be back in school in September which is something we all want. Next week school have been promised guidance about what this will look like. The Chair of Governors and myself are due to speak with our local MP shortly and we will be seeking further clarification on the Government plans. We will keep you updated—however experience is showing that we will probably not get any information before you do.

Teachers are currently busy writing an end of year report for all of our children. Freed up for the usual pressures of SATS and other assessments staff are relaxed and enjoying the time with YR, Y1 and the children in Essential Childcare. There's lots of laughter and music, playing out and making stuff. These are [happy days](#) in school.

In a contradiction though school still remains strangely sad. So many of our family are not with us, in fact 2/3 of our children are at home. Please don't think that they've been forgotten—we are missing every single child. Every member of staff is working hard to keep connected with children and their families. Miss Robinson and Mrs Bailey, our [Home Bubble](#) Teachers, are dropping into Google Classrooms and Tapestry. Mrs Kerr, Mrs Dwyer, and Mrs Fletcher are making phone calls home with speak to children—they have nearly managed two calls home for each child at home this week—phew! Don't worry if you miss their calls—they will phone back. If we haven't heard from your child via Tapestry or Google classroom, through a phone call or one of the online meets we will send them a postcard—a little nudge from us to remind them to keep in touch with their school family.


It has been through [Google Meet and Zoom](#) that our classes are beginning to reconnect again. Teachers have led taught sessions across the week which have enabled children in school to learn alongside those at home. Almost, but not quite, like being together again.

Our [Essential Childcare Bubbles](#) are quite full; each can hold a maximum of 15 children. Please only book a place if you are unable to care for your child at home—this is to ensure that Keyworkers who have to work away from home can use the service. We all need to support each other with this, otherwise we might be put into the position of having to turn people away. Please be aware that if you turn up without a previous booking and the bubble is full—we will have to turn your child away.

As our plans for [Y6 leavers](#) virtual celebrations continue to take shape so the next generation of our school prepares to begin. This week parents of children who will be joining [YR 2020/21](#) will be receiving our newsletter for the first time—welcome to the family! You will have already received the first of two packs of information in preparation for your child starting school, thank you for filling in the forms and returning them so promptly. A second pack will be emailed to you and posted on the school website next week—no more forms to fill in though (for now!)






NHS Track and Trace


