Dear Parents and Carers

At the start of the school year we have had our first governors' meeting and I thought it would be a good time to introduce you to the role of Governors within our School.

Governors have an important role to support and challenge the school leadership team, but also to monitor and support improvement and progress in teaching and learning across the school, as well as overseeing the financial performance of the school.

At the first Meeting of each year we mainly deal with procedural matters, such as individual roles and responsibilities for the Governors and the priorities for the development of the school this year. For the first time we also appointed Joint Chairs of the Governing Body, in recognition of how the role has and is changing. I am delighted that myself and Matthew Sugden have been appointed as Joint Chairs for the next three years; Jacky Dickinson was re-elected as Vice-Chair.

The Governing body has a number of different types of Governors. Mrs Beetles as Headteacher is a Governor, we have a Staff Governor, Local Authority Governor, Parent Governors and Co-opted Governors. Governors at our School have a wide range of skills and experience which they bring to their role as Governor.

At the moment we have vacancies for a Parent Governor, **for which there will be an election process next week** and two Co-opted Governors.

We believe that our Governing Body would be further strengthened with new governors with financial skills, links with the local business community or an interest in children with Additional or Different Educational Needs (SEND) However, if you have a different skill set to offer that you think would be valued, please also consider putting yourself forward too.

### Flu Vaccine Reminder

Please visit this online form to consent electronically for your child to receive their flu vaccine in school this autumn. Children in reception, year 1,2,3 and 4 are being offered the flu vaccine this year.

**\*Please note if you have already completed this, you do not need to do it again, this is a universal reminder letter.**

This vaccination programme is in place to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu.

**Please complete the online form** (one for each child) by the end of September 2017. Please ensure you read and understand all the information before you complete the online form. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children, and will be given by a quick and simple spray up the nose. Please go to the website shown above which includes details about the small number of children for whom the nasal vaccine is not appropriate. ### PARKING


Do you?...

**Drive up the unmade road in front of school?— Please don't!** Not only is this **private land**, the residents on Bridge Road have installed bollards at the back of their homes. This makes the road a **dead end** with the only way out being to reverse—doubly dangerous!

**Park on the Unmade Road in front of school? - Please don't!** We are not lucky enough to have a staff carpark—please be mindful that many of our staff arrive early and leave late and often have bags and boxes to bring into school. Don't make them walk further because you want a quick drop off or pick your children.

**Park in the Baptist Church Carpark? Please do but...** Rev Rob says he is happy for parents to use the church carpark but wants to make a plea for people to drive sensibly and not to block driveways. Please do not abuse the privilege of using the Church Carpark otherwise this may be withdrawn.

**Sometimes when challenged about their driving or parking ,drivers have become abusive to school staff or other parents—clearly this is not acceptable and sets a poor example to our children. If you are concerned about unsafe driving around our children do not hesitate to take the number plate and call 101 to notify the police who tell us that they will take the matter seriously.**
