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

We currently provide school meals through North Yorkshire County Catering. They are free for YR/Y1 & Y2 and cost £2.82 per day for other year groups. Meals are freshly cooked each day in our kitchen by NYCC Meals must be taken as a full week. With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For food ordering purposes the school office requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals.

## Library Group Meeting Minutes

The librarians are one of our six Pupil Voice Groups designed to enable children to become actively engaged in a leadership role in school. They keep the library spic and span, help choose new books and scan books so that our young borrowers can access an exciting range of reading material. At their most recent meeting they discussed:

### 1. New Librarians' Rota

- The Librarians 'Lunchtime' Rota has been changed to avoid clashes with MUPA and Tree house.
- Year 3 Librarians who were on lunchtime duty have now switched to Class Librarians and vice versa for this term. (as there are 10 librarians in YR3 - it is necessary to share out the duties)

## Attendance

Our overall attendance figure currently stands at 96.8 which is above our 95% target.

To the right you can see the monthly attendance figures for each class for September and October

Everyone knows that to make the best academic progress children need to be in school. Of course we don't want poorly children in school and we will always let you know if your child is unwell and needs picking up.

However, research tells us that an attendance of:

- 96% or above is a good attendance rate which will best support all aspects of your child's progress and attainment at school and promote a positive work ethic
- 94% - 95% is an attendance rate which is considered a minimum level to support your child's progress and attainment at school
- 85% - 93% is a poor attendance rate which can affect a child's learning, attainment and progress at school
- Below 85% is an unacceptable attendance rate which disrupts a child's learning, attainment and progress at school.

If you are experiencing difficulty in getting your child to school please contact us—we will do our best to help you, and if we can't we will put you in touch with people who can!


