Thank you to all parents and carers who completed our survey 2015. We had over three quarters of families 123/154 (80%) return rate which is great. As a school, we are delighted to have received such positive feedback which will now be published on the school website.

When analysing the data, we see that there are very few 'disagrees' and 'strongly disagrees' in any areas.

Question 8 raises some interesting points: 'The school deals effectively with bullying' with 25.4% of respondents indicating that they 'don't know.'

Two possible explanations could be that ;

- Parents have no experience of bullying issues in our school
- Parents are unaware of processes in place for dealing with bullying in school.

Statistically, many schools report that this question often receives similar responses possibly due to its ambiguity.

Anti Bullying Strategies in place at Sutton CP

- Like all schools we have a robust anti bullying policy which is reviewed every year by the School Council, Staff and Governors. A copy of this can be found on our website: <http://www.wherelernersgrow.co.uk>
- Each year, as part of policy review, we hold a series of whole school assemblies usually during National Anti Bullying week (usually around the end of October.) This enables staff and pupils to focus on issues around bullying, including understanding the signs to look for and what to do.
- When children are unhappy at school they are always encouraged to speak to a grown up who will be able to help them solve problems. If you, as a parent, are at all concerned, please contact school to arrange a mutually convenient time to either come in or have a telephone appointment.

As a result of the policies and procedures we have in school, allegations of bullying are actually very rare in our school.
