Introduction

At Sutton in Craven CP School assessment procedures focus on Year Group expectations.

The Department for Education states that:

- On -going, teacher led assessment is a crucial part of effective teaching;
- Schools should have the freedom to decide how to teach their curriculum and how to track the progress that pupils make;
- Both ongoing teacher assessment and external testing are important
- School systems for assessment must be fair and transparent;
- Measures of progress and attainment are of equal importance and should both be used to assess school performance.
- Information should be published in various forms to parents and the wider public to inform them how well schools are doing.

Sutton CP's Purpose of Assessment

- To ensure teaching is pitched at an appropriate level in order for children to make at least good progress
- To enable analysis of trends which lead to school improvement.
- To inform discussion with pupils, parents/carers, school leaders and governors, moderators and assessors
- To support transition between year groups and schools.

The Sutton CP Assessment Procedure for Reading, Writing, Maths and Science;

We use the following continuous assessment which relate to age -group expectations

Working within the typical band for each age group, children are assessed as:

Beginning

If this is achieved in the Autumn term pupils are on track to reach ARE (age related expectations) by the end of the year.

Within:

If this is achieved in the Spring term pupils are on track to reach ARE (age related expectations) by the end of the year.

Secure:

If this is achieved at the end of the year pupils are working at ARE (age related expectations)

Secure Plus:

Children can apply age related knowledge in many contexts and through rich and sophisticated problems and are working at greater depth.

We use Target Tracker Software to track children's progress and attainment We use "beginning", "within" and "secure" in the age band

At the end of Autumn term, the child was assessed as working within the year 2 band - $2W = \lambda$ "within" At the end of Spring term, the child was assessed as being secure in the age band - 3B = 3 "beginning"

Teachers make judgements at the end of each term and submit these on Target Tracker. They are used to analyze trends for groups and identify pupils making less than expected progress. They inform Pupil Progress meetings that also happen termly.

The progress a pupil makes in a term/ year and key stage is also tracked using steps. A child making expected progress will achieve 2 steps each term, 6 steps in a year, 12 steps over KS1 and 24 steps over KS2.

Evidencing Judgements

Research tells us that the best teachers do not need to rely on testing alone but are able to weave effective assessment into everyday practice.

This will include:

- · Pupil Self assessment
- · Pupil peer assessment
- · Deep and Rich questioning
- · Discussion
- · Observation
- · Pupil Work

Judgements are regularly moderated by all staff, led by senior leaders
