
### **Parking Poster**

Everley - I really liked running with my friends and it was also fun watching others race.





## The Craven MHST supporting Sutton C.P. School

+‡+ Hi, I am Sarah and I work with the Bradford and Craven Mental health Services Team with Sutton CP school. We work in low intensity CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy), in 1:1, group and whole class formats. We work with young people with mild to moderate mental health issues such as anxiety, low mood, phobias, and sleep problems. We also run staff and parent workshops, which you will be notified about by the school or if there are other events you may be interested in attending. ADVICE, SIGNPOSTING As well as working directly 1:1 with young people, and SUPPORT. parents/carers of young people, we offer consultations and signposting advice to those who need it. We work closely with school staff to offer support so, if you need anything, please let your school contact know and they can get in touch with me. HOW DO YOU GET SUPPORT FOR YOUR CHILD? Speak to a member of school staff and ask about the Complete a referral form with a member of staff. The MHST and school staff will meet to make sure we are the right service, or if we can work with school to establish the most appropriate service. If we do work with you child, we will offer a shortterm intervention relevant to their concerns. I have been working with the lovely Year 6 pupils and Autumn Term 1, 2023 staff to deliver a 6 Week Emotional Resilience Programme. Highlights have been 'Baking Best Friend', positive affirmations and dealing with conflict in relationships. We have also practiced some calming breath techniques and mindfulness! Next, I look forward to working on a range of workshops across the year groups.
