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#### <u>Measles</u>

This year, has seen a significant rise in cases compared to last year across the country, particularly in children aged 10 and below. Although the rise in figures was not directly involving the Craven area, the cases are spreading.

In recent years, the number of children vaccinated against measles has fallen. Children are offered the first dose of the MMR vaccine when aged one year and the second dose aged 3 years 4 months. UKHSA is urging parents of young children, teenagers and adults to check they are up to date with their MMR vaccines. To see if your child is up to date with their MMR vaccines, check your child's personal child health record (PCHR), known as 'the red book', or contact your GP practice. If anyone has missed one or both doses of the MMR vaccine, contact your GP practice to book an appointment. It is never too late to catch up.

Symptoms include a high fever, sore red watery eyes and a blotchy red-brown rash, and it is particularly easy to catch in environments when in close contact with others. Measles is a highly infectious viral illness, so anyone with symptoms is advised to stay at home and phone their GP or NHS 111 for advice before visiting the surgery. Any suspected or confirmed cases must be reported to school as soon as possible.

In school, we will continue to promote good hygiene practices such as coughing into the crease of our elbow, washing hands, ventilation etc. Hopefully, this will not impact on our community too much this term.
