Welcome back! We have had a lovely week in school welcoming the children back to school and hearing all about their time away from the classroom. It has been a successful and happy start to the year and we are all looking forward to everything that this year will bring.

Just a few safeguarding reminders for the start of the year...

Absence and lateness

If you know your child is going to be absent from school please make sure you <u>telephone the school office on 01535 633064 by 9:30am</u> to ensure that the correct registration mark is given and staff can be informed. Please leave a voice message on the school answering service if you are unable to telephone during office hours. Please do not send emails on the first day of absence as these may not be picked up by 9:30am.

Our school gates open at 8:50am and the school doors at 8:55am. The classroom register will close at 9:10am and any children arriving after this time are required to come to the school office accompanied by an adult to sign the late register. If a child has been authorized to walk to school independently, they must sign themselves in at the school office. This sign-in register is very important and we welcome your support in making sure that is completed appropriately. Any child arriving after 9:10am will receive an <u>authorised</u> late mark.

If a child has not arrived in school by 9:30am and we have not received a telephone call/message regarding a known absence, the school office will telephone home to investigate the absence further. Any arrivals after this time will be an <u>unauthorised</u> late mark.

After school club attendance

If you know that your child has been added to an after school club register and will not be attending the club, please telephone the school office so that your child's name can be removed from the club register, before 3:15pm. Taking a child as they are released with their class at the end of the school day, without notifying the office, can cause unnecessary safeguarding concerns and miscommunication.

All our evacuation procedures are dependent upon registers being accurate so we welcome your support with this.



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After School Clubs

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PE Uniform

Children should come to school wearing the following uniform on PE days:

Tuck Shop


