School meals cost £2.10 per day for each child. They are freshly cooked each day in our Kitchen by Mrs. Johnson. Meals must be taken as a full week. With the exception of promotional meals (such as Christmas Dinner) we do not have the capacity to offer 'one off meals' For ordering purposes the school office requires one week's notice to change to/from school meals. **This is still the case even if your child has a free school meals in KS1.**

SUTTON'S GOT BRASS - WINNER OF THE ART AND CULTURE AWARD

A special prize evening was held at The Coniston Hotel on January 12, 2017, to celebrate the outstanding achievements of Craven's communities. The awards ceremony celebrate to some amazing people who work hard to help make Craven special. Our very own, 'Sutton's Got Brass' is a community brass band, formed in 2014 after the head teacher of a local primary school (*Mrs Beetles!*) made the inspired decision to enter a contest to compete for a People's Lottery Grant of £50,000 to establish a community brass band.



The last time Sutton-in-Craven had a band was in the 17th century, but with the help of the entire Sutton community, the bid was won, the band was set up and it now has 15 members, aged from eight to 82, from many different backgrounds. Anyone can join, even if they have never played a musical instrument. The group offers free tuition, free loan of a brass instrument and subs of £1 per week. Members include pensioners, primary school children and people of differing races and religions..

Anyone interested in joining the band can turn up at its weekly rehearsal at school on Wednesdays, from 7pm to 8.30pm.

REMINDERS

Attendance

We ask that children are **not** taken out of school for routine appointments (such as dental/medical/optician) Proof of any appointment during the school day is always required. If you fail to provide this your child's absence may be recorded as unauthorised which may lead to referral to the Area Prevention Service. If your child is absent you should notify school by phone before 9.30 am..

School Uniform

We pride ourselves on the appearance of our school and this includes school uniform. There is plenty of choice within our uniform code for children to express their individuality— please note that we do not encourage children to wear

brightly coloured trainers and shoes with flashing lights can be a great distraction in school!

Lunch boxes

We have clearly labelled trolleys to keep lunch boxes on for each class. Packed lunches are stored during the morning in a cool place and children are asked not to keep their lunch in the cloakroom where there are heating pipes. We therefore ask that when your child brings a lunchbox to school, it is small enough to fit on the trolleys. The trolleys take standard size children's lunchboxes but are not built to store large bags.

PE bags and kit

New PE bags

When your children start school here at Sutton CP we give them a school pump bag for their PE kit. Unfortunately these won't last forever. New ones can be purchased for £4.00 on the uniform service of parent pay and then collected from the school office. PE bags should be brought to school every Monday and taken home for washing every Friday. Please ensure PE kit is labelled with your child's name. Children from Y1-Y6 need black shorts, white T shirt and pumps/trainers. You might like to send them with dark coloured jogging bottoms and a school purple sports hoodie in colder weather. Your child will be able to tell you whether they are planning inside or outside PE this term. We do not have the space to store large unwieldy bags and ask that children **do not bring them into school**—school book bags can be purchased for home learning/reading books. Jewellery including hooped earrings are not permitted. Pierced earrings should be removed for PE and swimming.

Water bottles cost £1.50 from the school office

Book bags can be ordered through the office at a cost of £9.

Medicines in School

If your child needs to take a prescribed medicine during the school day, please see Mrs Wallace in the school office to complete a form. Non prescribed medications (such as cough sweets) are not allowed in school.

This week the teachers had training from a Maths Consultant—Sharon Day. One element we discussed was children knowing their times tables. This linked in well with the Times Tables Challenge we had started last term.
