<u>School PE Uniform</u>

A polite reminder about PE uniform.

Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class;
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents;
- is designed with health and safety in mind.

We do have a 'New to You' uniform option in school, which we encourage you to use—please contact the school office. Before we finish for summer we will have a formal 'New to You' sale in preparation for September. We have so much nearly new uniform it seems such a shame not to re-use and get the very most out it, whilst saving a few pounds. If your child has long hair, this needs tying back on PE days and earrings need removing or covering with tape—these are health and safety measures we must adhere to. Finally, leggings and/or jogging bottoms must be kept to either black or grey to avoid any unnecessary distractions for the children. As always, we appreciate your support with this.
